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

What is a Research Tree ("Quick and Dirty Tree")

- A speculative family tree that may or may not be correct
- Used to test hypotheses
- Particularly useful in Ancestry as a tree can be used to pick up source hints
- Because it is speculative and may or may not be correct it is important to *ALWAYS* set a research tree as Private and unsearchable



Why Build Research Trees?

- Building a tree for a DNA match
 - Maybe they already have an existing tree
 - By building it you have control over what records to be sourced in the tree
 - May highlight possible issues with the DNA match's tree
 - No tree but use public records to start tree
 - Need to have full name
 - Use public records to get birth date
 - Use people finding sites (e.g., BeenVerified) to get relatives, especially parents names
- Testing a possible ancestor for a possible connection to your tree
- Guilty pleasure building trees for famous people

Remember---These are Speculative Trees


- You are building them to test hypotheses and to build sources to support your hypotheses
- Very Important these need to be kept Private and Unsearchable in Ancestry
 - WHY?
 - To prevent adding potentially incorrect details and incorrect trees that others might search for and assume are valid

Starting with a DNA Match

- Do you have a name?
 - Yes
 - Search for the person in people finding sites like BeenVerified
 - If found, get the birthdate
 - Look for parents (also siblings which could yield parents)
 - Search for the person in Ancestry
 - Some public records may have birthdates
 - Search for the person on Facebook
 - Some people have "open" profiles that assist in identifying parents/children/siblings
 - Once you have full name, date of birth, and possible birth location: BUILD THE TREE

Tip: Check Account for Details

- Click on the match name to get account details
 - Sometimes you can get location and age range



Use this information to narrow down individual in people finding sites (e.g., BeenVerified) to get birth date and possible parents

Starting with a DNA Match

- Do you have a name?
 - No
 - Is the kit name an alias? If so, then search for it on Google
 - If the kit name is simply initials then it may be very difficult
 - Often a kit with initials is "admin'ed" by someone else --- this might help yield a last name
 - Before giving up---look at shared matches as you might get lucky to find a sibling or parent/child that does have full name
 - If all this fails then you might not be able to identify the mystery match



Process Note


• I will focus on a historical example rather than a living person for privacy purposes

Working a Historical Case

- You may want to focus on a historical person, either someone generations back in your tree or possibly a famous person (curiosity or looking for a connection to your tree)
- Let's try an example: George H. W. Bush, 41st President of the U.S.

Start a new tree

Under Trees, select Create & Manage Trees



Home Person

- Enter details for the home person
 - Important: include as much as possible with full name, birth/death details



George Bush

- Look for facts that you can use to build the tree
 - Full name
 - Date, location of birth
 - Date, location of death

George H. < W. Bush

41st U.S. President

Bornt June 12, 1924, Milton, MA



Start the Tree









Next Person


- Ancestry wants you to add one more person before saving and naming a tree
- Just click "Add father" and click Save
 - We can worry about the details later
 - Of course we could always look up the father's details but we'll just let Ancestry find those for this example






Name & Save


- Enter name
- Uncheck to make tree "Private"
- Click "Save tree"



Making Tree Unsearchable

Setting to Private is not enough --you want the tree to also be
unsearchable







Also prevent your tree from being found in searches.

Work the Hints

 Look for the green leafs indicating tree hints


 Click on the cell with the leaf hint and then on the link for ancestry hints





Review Hints

- For famous people it's typical to have a lot of hints
- I recommend just to look for standard good sources rather than things like Member Photos
 - U.S. Census
 - Public Records
 - Social Security Death Index



Add Good Sources


US Census


- Very useful to finding parents names and approximate birth dates
- As always, make sure this record correctly matches the person in your tree
- I like to add at least one source to every person, if possible
- Click "Review"



Adding Sources

- Click "Yes" to add to the tree
- Note the new addition of George's apparent parents, Prescott Bush and Dorothy Bush
- Pay CAREFUL attention to Step 2
 - You may see new information (check the box on the left side if you want to add it to the tree)





Adding Sources

- Be sure to click the check boxes for each of the persons who you want this source to show for
- In this case we'll just click on the parents and skip the siblings (Prescott Jr. and Nancy)
 - Depending on your goals with the tree you may want to include siblings





Good Sources

Public Records are also very useful and often yield birth dates




Sources

- I like Find-A-Grave also....BUT
 - I always want to have supporting evidence before using information from it since it is "crowd-sourced" --- errors can be found
 - If the record is good it can yield very useful information birth/death, parents, etc.


George Herbert Walker Bush

Enter details


Note that Samuel Bush has no dates shown




Enter details

Use the Ancestry hints to get dates









Add details

Now, for Flora Sheldon






In Summary

- Research trees can be extremely useful
- Keep the trees Private and Unsearchable
- Strive to use full names (maiden for women) with birth/death dates/locations to get more hint matches
- Use to help identify DNA matches
